On September 30, 1962, Lutherans from across Michigan gathered on the grounds of the former Earhart estate in Ann Arbor to install the cornerstone of a building that would soon become the centerpiece of a new college. The vision of Concordia is to be well-known nationally and internationally as a premier Lutheran, Christian university, widely recognized for meaningful integration of faith and learning. Alumni will assume significant servant leadership responsibilities in the Church and communities across the nation and throughout the world.

Admission Requirements

Candidates will need to submit the following:

- 1. Completed Application
- 2. Determine how you will pay for the program
- 3. Official Transcripts from all institutions attended
- 4. Essay
- 5. Resume
- 6. Government ID
- 7. Introduction Video

Students must maintain a 3.0 GPA once enrolled in the program

*Acclerated Bachelor's applicants will complete steps 1-3. In addition, a background check is required. Must have a 2.75 GPA for full admission.

Transfer Credits

Students who have completed graduate-level courses at another institution may transfer graduate credits, if the courses are judged equivalent to those required for Concordia University Ann Arbor's graduate program.
